Chairman Brick, T/Perry brought up the increase for the Sheriff's salary in comparison to the Undersheriff. If the current practice continues the Undersheriff will make more than the Sheriff...

There was a conversation relative to promises made that the Sheriff would receive the same rate increase as the Deputy Sheriffs. County Admin. Schrader offered that this is a "horrible" practice. If this should be the practice, the Sheriff should not be part of contract negotiations. He is essentially negotiating his own salary. He concluded by explaining both he and HR Director Farberman are working with the Sheriff on finding comparable salaries. County Admin. Schrader also suggested another solution would be to add the title of Sheriff to the M/MC Schedule and Wage Scales (by local law).
