Bowles; Covington - Kenneth C. Lowe; Eagle - Rita R. George; Gainesville - Bernard Erhart; Genesee Falls - Edward A. Hamilton; Java - Thomas R. Moran; Middlebury - C. Arnold Cox; Orangeville - Roy H. Haller, Jr.; Perry - Ross W. Roberts; Pike - E. Dwight Gillette; Sheldon - Irene M. Glaus; Warsaw - Alexandra J. Lane; Wethersfield - Ronald P. Herman, Sr.

Mrs. Millen called for nominations for Temporary Chairman. Supervisor Moran nominated Supervisor Roberts, seconded by Supervisor Gillette. Supervisor Erhart moved that the nominations be closed. Salaries for Schedule C employees at the Wyoming County Community Hospital and Nursing Facility, including hospital administrator and other non-union management positions shall be reviewed and set on an annual basis by a compensation committee which shall be composed of the Finance Committee, consisting of five (5) members of the Board of Supervisors, and an equal number of the Board of Managers including the members of the Executive Committee.

D. In the event that the Wyoming County Community Hospital and Nursing Facility may need an appropriation of funds in addition to any budgeted amount, it shall be the duty of the Board of Managers and the Hospital Administrator to request the same at least thirty (30) days prior to the contemplated appropriation. Any such requests shall be written and state the amount of the appropriation and the underlying rationale for the request.

E. The Board of Managers shall submit annual operating and capital budgets and shall submit quarterly financial statements directly to the Board of Supervisors.

F. The Board of Managers is authorized to accept and administer all grants, awards and gifts made to the Wyoming County the Board of Managers shall create and abolish all positions of Community Hospital and Nursing Facility by any person or outside agency, including the State and Federal government, and may accept grants, awards and gifts requiring the matching of funds or of other financial commitments on the part of the County of Wyoming only where such funds can be obtained from approved budget sources.

Unwelcome sexual advances, requests for sexual favors, and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature constitute sexual harassment when (1) submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of an individual's employment, (2) submission to or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as the basis for employment decisions affecting such individual, or (3) such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with and individual's work performance or creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive working environment.

It is also the policy of the County to prohibit such conduct. Any employee who subjects another employee to sexual harassment will be subject to disci-

plinary action, up to and including discharge.

Any employee who is a victim of sexual harassment should immediately report such conduct either to the employee's Department Head or to the Office of the County Attorney which will promptly conduct an investigation of the alleged sexual harassment, taking appropriate measures to protect the privacy and confidentiality of the parties involved.

Section 2. SEQR DETERMINATION: On July 14, 1988, the Board of Supervisors of the said County, as Lead Agency, determined that the aforesaid project is an Unlisted Action as defined by the SEQR Regulations of the State of New York which will not have a significant effect on the environment.

Section 3. The maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is now determined to be \$9,200,000, and the plan for the financing thereof is as follows:

a) By the issuance of \$7,600,000 serial bonds of said County heretofore authorized therefor pursuant to bond resolution No. 89-262 duly adopted by the Board of Supervisors of said County on November 14, 1989;

b) By the appropriation and expenditure of \$400,000 from the Building and Equipment Capital Reserve Fund of said County, heretofore authorized; and

c) By the issuance of the additional \$1,200,000 serial bonds of said County hereby authorized to be issued therefor pursuant to the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. To the extent that the authorization set forth in this resolution is inconsistent with the current capital budget of said County, such capital budget is hereby amended.

Section 5. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid specific object or purpose is thirty years, pursuant to subdivision 11(a)(1) of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law, com-

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puted from December 20, 1989, the date of the first bond anticipation note issued therefor.

Section 6. The faith and credit of said County of Wyoming, New York, are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same respectively become due and payable. An annual appropriation shall be made in each year sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds becoming due and payable in such year. There shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property in said County, a tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on such bonds as the same become due and payable.

Section 7. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the County Treasurer of said County, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said County Treasurer, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 8. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the serial bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same and also including the consolidation with other issues, shall be determined by the County Treasurer, the chief fiscal officer of such County. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for the Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the County Treasurer shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 9. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

1) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said County is not authorized to expend money, or

2) The provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

3) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 10. This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in full in the Perry Herald and the Wyoming County Times, which are hereby designated as the official newspapers of said County for such purpose,
