## PREPARING FOR FAIR SEASON!

Show animal health and fair requirements presentation by Dr. Allen Fournier, DVM

Monday, May 12th at 6:30PM  
Ag & Business Center, Warsaw

Dr. Fournier is the New York State Department of Agriculture and Markets Field Veterinarian for our region. He will be joining us to talk about common health issues seen in 4-H project animals along with prevention and treatment. He will also outline current animal health guidelines for exhibiting animals at fair. This will be a great opportunity to speak with a veterinarian and learn more about why health papers and vet inspections are necessary parts of our 4-H and show process.



Like public presentations, when you sign in to the event, we will have you mark what species you would like the event to count towards. Please call the 4-H office to register before the meeting by calling us at 585-786-2251 or using this QR code to register.



*This meeting will satisfy the educational requirement for one of any species of animals at the 2025 Wyoming County Fair.*

  - **June 1st** – Horse Certificates
  - **June 1st** – Dairy Grade & Lease Certificates
- **June 1st** – Beef, Goat, and Sheep Breeding Animal Grade and Lease Certificates
- **July 15th** – All 4-H Animal Fair Entries (beef, dairy, dog, horse, poultry, rabbit, sheep, goat, and swine) are due to the 4-H office
  - **August 1st** – Open Show Entries are due to the Wyoming County Fair Association

All fair entry forms will be available in mid-June once Fair books are available.



Posters used for current year presentation; poster minimum 14" x 22" – acceptable to use both sides of poster. If presentation includes more than one poster, enter as one exhibit. The poster will be evaluated on content, illustrations, organization, clarity, visual appeal and readability. Presentations will occur in 15-minute intervals during fair week. Watch for an article in the June 4-H News for more details on signing up to do your presentation.

Remember: A demonstration is considered a fair entry and can be listed on your voucher to receive a premium. It is also a great opportunity to share information and practice for next year's presentations.

*Note: 4-H'ers giving a demonstration will receive \$5.00 for their first demonstration. Senior demonstrators will receive an additional \$2.50 for presenting their demonstration twice.*





Explore the different cuisines around the world, along with their cultures and heritage!


There are hundreds of cultures and cuisines across the globe, we challenge you, as 4-H independent and club members, to select a country and research the origins of the foods they eat and their culinary histories and traditions!

It's easy! As a club (or independent member), pick a nation in the world you are interested in exploring! Over the next several months, gather information on the region's cuisine, including styles of cooking or special dishes, and the history or origins of the food item(s) or recipes. You may choose a country or region of the USA.

As an opportunity to highlight what members learn from participating in this experience, Wyoming County 4-H will host a 'Delicious Destinations - Exploring Foods throughout the World' event on Monday evening, April 14th, 2025. In planning for an evening that will be interesting and enjoyable for everyone, your club (or independent members) should be prepared to:

- Share samples of a food/dish that is representative of your region/city with other participants.
- All food samples must be prepared prior to the event, and prepackaged for distribution.
- Plan a short presentation (5 minutes max) to share what you have learned with others.
- Put together a small display highlighting what you learned by participating in the project (i.e. posters, photographs, clothing, recipes, etc.)

Pre-registration is required as spacing is limited. This will provide a great opportunity for everyone to discover 'delicious destinations' by sampling foods and sharing information, without leaving Wyoming County (or even the room)! Call the 4-H office for questions or to sign up by April 1st!



CCE Wyoming County will host Drs. Hunter Adams and Jonathan Jaramillo for this opportunity focused on sensor technologies and how they, along with robotics, can assist us in managing agricultural and horticultural production. Both Hunter and Jonathan are lecturers at Cornell University specializing in robotics, sensor technology, and the geographic management of water, nutrients, and livestock.

The session will be divided, Hunter in one room/Jonathan in the other, with adults in one group and kids in the other. Each group will get an hour to interact with the teacher, then you will switch rooms so that both adults and youth are engaged, providing insights into how sensor technologies function, showcasing examples of their applications, and discussing ways we can innovate with these technologies to enhance the efficiency of managing livestock and field or horticultural crops. There will be hands-on learning in each session.

This is the first in a series of workshops that CCE Wyoming County is offering to “get our hands dirty” by learning about and utilizing sensor technologies. That can mean everything from testing and integrating biosensors that monitor the health of individual dairy cows to developing a process for assessing crop fertilizer application via drones and satellites.

# LIVESTOCK LEASE AND GRADE PAPERWORK

Again in 2025, the 4-H office will start collecting lease and grade paperwork for breeding beef and sheep. All 4-H project animals should be owned or leased and under 4-H members care by June 1st.

Lease and grade forms are due on June 1st, and they are available on our website or in the 4-H office. These forms will allow the 4-H office plan better for animal numbers at the fair in addition to add some project ownership and responsibility for animals. Copies of registration papers should be submitted along with fair entries for those animals that have them.

Meat animal projects in addition to other non-auction market projects do not currently need ownership forms. 



**Can I use one Educational Event for multiple species?** The short answer is no. Some events like public presentations can be used for different species but you must designate which species. The only exception is livestock, where we group beef, sheep and swine together as a “species” and one event will cover these groups. We of course encourage youth to take part in more than just one event for any species!

**Clover Buds (Ages 5-7 as of 1/1/25):** Clover buds can bring any age-appropriate exhibits to the youth building at fair. The fair book is full of project examples including baked goods, crafts, flowers, vegetables, and much more under the general youth building entries. The items can be worked on in a club setting or at home with family. School projects should not be exhibited as 4-H projects. Clover buds will bring entries to the fair on Friday, August 9th for “evaluation” and receive participation ribbons. Entries will stay at the youth building for the duration of fair, on display. Watch upcoming 4-H updates for any pre-registration information. Clover buds can also exhibit a chicken, duck, rabbit, or leadline horse project at the fair. Youth must attend a poultry or rabbit showmanship clinic or a horse educational event to learn how to properly show their animal. Pre-registration in the form of a fair entry is required by July 15th. Watch the June 4-H News for information and deadlines.

**Youth Building Exhibits (Ages 8-18 as of 1/1/25):** Youth building exhibits cover a wide range of items such as baking, crafts, sewing, flowers, vegetables, photography, posters, and SO MUCH more! The guidelines for each project exhibit can be found in the fair book under Department H, Sections 16-18. The items can be worked on in a club setting or at home with family. School projects should not be exhibited as 4-H projects. There are no educational event requirements for youth building projects. Youth members will bring entries to the fair on Friday, August 8th for evaluation. Entries will stay at the youth building for the duration of the fair, on display. You will want to fill out paperwork before you go to the fair with your projects. Watch upcoming 4-H updates for any pre-registration information. Some entries may qualify to move on to the NYS Fair!

**Dairy Cattle (Ages 8-18 as of 1/1/25):** 4-H Dairy cattle exhibitors must own or lease their project animals by June 1, 2025. Lease and Grade animal paperwork is due to the 4-H office by June 1st. Please contact us with any animal ownership questions before the deadline. To exhibit dairy animals, youth members must complete one of the specified education events for the dairy program. Pre-registration in the form of a fair entry is also required by July 15th. Watch the June 4-H News for information and deadlines on fair entries. Youth do have an opportunity to exhibit at the NYS Fair. If you are interested in that opportunity, you will need to notify the 4-H office when you submit your county fair entry.

**Dogs (Ages 8-18 as of 1/1/25):** 4-H Dog exhibitors are participants in the ongoing dog obedience program. Youth members should refer to the current 4-H Dog Care & Obedience Project guide for classes, events and registration deadlines. Some entries may qualify to move on to the NYS Fair!

**Goats (Ages 8-18 as of 1/1/25):** 4-H Goat exhibitors must own or lease their project animals by June 1, 2025. To exhibit goats, youth members must complete one of the specified education events for the goat program. Pre-registration in the form of a fair entry is also required by July 15th. Watch the June 4-H News for information and deadlines on fair entries. Youth do have an opportunity to exhibit at the NYS Fair. If you are interested in that opportunity, you will need to notify the 4-H office when you submit your county fair entry.

**Horses (Ages 8-18 as of 1/21/25):** 4-H Horse exhibitors must own or lease their project animals and have 4-H horse certificates on file with the 4-H office by June 1st. Youth members must also be evaluated on one project horse to determine a riding level. Youth can be evaluated to "move up" in levels as appropriate. To exhibit horses, youth members must complete one of the specified education events for the horse program. Pre-registration in the form of a fair entry is also required by July 15th. Watch the June 4-H News for information and deadlines on fair entries. Junior & Senior riders have an opportunity to exhibit at the NYS Fair. If you are interested in that opportunity, you will need to participate in the 4-H horse show on July 13th.

**Meat Animal Auction Projects for Beef, Lambs, Swine, Poultry & Goats (Ages 8 – 18 as of 1/1/25):** Youth members interested in any of the auction programs should read the specific rules and guidelines for the species you are interested in. There are specific enrollment and educational event requirements for each species that can be found in the rule packets. In addition, pre-registration in the form of a fair entry is required by July 15th. Watch the June 4-H News for information and deadlines on fair entries.

**Non-Auction Beef Sheep & Swine (Ages 8-18 as of 1/1/25):** Youth members do NOT have to participate in the livestock auction project to show beef, sheep or pigs at the fair during 4-H shows. Youth must own or lease their project animals by June 1, 2025. We have non auction showmanship, market classes, and breeding animal classes for these species. They are a great way to learn how to raise and show livestock before jumping into the auction program. To exhibit beef, sheep or pigs, youth members must complete one of the specified education events for the livestock program. Pre-registration in the form of a fair entry is also required by July 15th. Watch the June 4-H News for information and deadlines on fair entries. Youth do have an opportunity to exhibit at the NYS Fair. If you are interested in that opportunity, you will need to notify the 4-H office when you submit your county fair entry.

**Poultry (Ages 8-18 as of 1/1/25):** 4-H poultry exhibitors must own or lease their project animals by June 1, 2025. Entries may be limited due to space. To exhibit poultry, youth members must complete one of the specified education events for the poultry program. Pre-registration in the form of a fair entry is also required by July 15th. Watch the June 4-H News for information and deadlines on fair entries. Youth do have an opportunity to exhibit at the NYS Fair. If you are interested in that opportunity, you will need to notify the 4-H office when you submit your county fair entry.

**Rabbits & Cavies (Ages 8-18 as of 1/1/25):** 4-H rabbit/cavy exhibitors must own or lease their project animals by June 1, 2025. To exhibit rabbits or cavies, youth members must complete one of the specified education events for the rabbit program, typically public presentation or rabbit showmanship meeting. Pre-registration in the form of a fair entry is also required by July 15th. Watch the June 4-H News for information and deadlines on fair entries. Youth do have an opportunity to exhibit at the NYS Fair. If you are interested in that opportunity, you will need to notify the 4-H office when you submit your county fair entry.
