During the COVID-19 response, Wyoming County residents with pre-existing chronic conditions are reminded to take care of themselves. We know that certain people are at higher risk for severe illness, including:

- Older adults
- People with chronic lung disease or moderate to severe asthma
- People who have serious heart conditions
- People who are immunocompromised (many conditions can cause a person to be immunocompromised, including cancer treatment, smoking, bone marrow or organ transplantation, immune deficiencies, poorly controlled HIV or AIDS, and prolonged use of corticosteroids and other immune weakening medications)
- People with severe obesity (body mass index [BMI] of 40 or higher)
- People with diabetes
- People with chronic kidney disease undergoing dialysis
- People with liver disease

Residents with chronic medical conditions should maintain contact with their primary healthcare provider for ongoing personal care, including medication management. Call your healthcare provider to discuss phone consultations or tele-medicine options. Stay home as much as possible to slow the spread, but do not avoid getting the care you need during this time.

Chairman of the Wyoming County Board of Supervisors, Jerry L. Davis, reports: As of earlier today, Thursday, April 9, the Wyoming County Health Department reports thirty-two (32) lab-confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents, an increase of 3 cases from yesterday.
