**PRESS RELEASE
December 2, 2021**

With colder weather and the holiday season upon us, we will be spending more time together indoors. It is important to remember we are still in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic and the beginning of flu season. Wyoming County has had a 14.5% positivity rate over the last 7 days, far above the statewide average. For unvaccinated adults, the pandemic remains a daily threat, and a personal choice to stay unvaccinated will continue to put you and those around you at risk. Please get vaccinated if you are still unvaccinated, get a booster if you are eligible, wear a mask when you cannot be socially distant and stay home if you are sick.

The COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective. Anyone 5 years and older is eligible to receive a vaccine. Wyoming County Health Department encourages Wyoming County residents who are not fully vaccinated to begin their COVID-19 vaccine series. COVID-19 vaccination is especially important for families with children attending school or child care.

YOUTH VACCINATIONS AT NYS VAX SITES

New York State’s community vaccination sites in Buffalo and Rochester are now administering the COVID-19 vaccine to newly eligible 5 to 11 year-olds. Parents and guardians can make appointments at a state-run vaccine site for their child/ren at ny.gov/vaccine.

Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of Thursday, December 2, 2021, the Wyoming County Health Department reports four thousand three hundred sixty (4,360) lab-confirmed positive community cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. This is an increase of one hundred eighty-nine (189) cases since the last reported increase on Wednesday, November 24, 2021. There are currently one hundred eighty-nine (189) laboratory-confirmed active COVID-19 cases in Wyoming County.

The Centers for Disease Control characterizes COVID community transmission in Wyoming County as **“High”** between November 24, 2021 – November 30, 2021.
