Booster* Vaccinations:

Pfizer Booster – Tuesday, 1/11/2022
Moderna Booster – Tuesday, 1/11/2022

Initial Vaccinations:

First Dose Pfizer Ages 5-11 – Tuesday, 1/11/2022
First Dose Pfizer Ages 12 and older - Tuesday, 1/11/2022
First Dose Moderna – Tuesday, 1/11/2022

NEW:

- The high volume of COVID-19 case reports in recent days exceeds the WCHD and NYS contact tracing capacity to individually contact every Wyoming County resident with a positive COVID-19 test result. New York State Department of Health announced that beginning next week changes will be implemented to case investigation and contact tracing. Community transmission of COVID-19 is very high in Wyoming County, please wear a mask and isolate if you have symptoms or have tested positive.
- Effective Tuesday, January 11th, residents will be able to visit www.wyomingco.net and choose “Report a Positive COVID-19 Home Test” under the “*Quick Links*” option to self-report a positive at home COVID-19 test. You will be notified by NYS by email or text message how to access your “AFFIRMATION OF ISOLATION”. Please provide accurate contact information when you report your positive test. Anyone who tests positive for COVID-19 should self-isolate immediately for 5 days: Day 0 is the day of symptom onset, or (if asymptomatic) the day of collection of the first positive specimen. If you have no symptoms or your symptoms are resolving after 5 days, you can leave your house. Continue to wear a mask around others for 5 additional days. It is important to continue with self-isolation from household members as much as you are able.
- A limited number of free at-home COVID-19 test kits are now available in the community. New York State provided the Wyoming County Emergency Management Office with free at-home COVID-19 test kits for residents. Starting Friday, January 7, 2022, each Library in Wyoming County will have a limited supply of COVID-19 test kits to distribute to residents during normal business hours until the kits are gone. ***The Health Department does not have free at-home test kits or KN95 masks; please do not call or visit the Health Department for test kits or masks.***

- Given changes announced by the NYS Department of Health, the format of weekly Press Releases will update beginning next week. The NYSDOH COVID-19 data dashboard can be located here: <https://coronavirus.health.ny.gov/covid-19-data-new-york>. Community transmission of COVID-19 is very high, please wear a well-fitting mask in public settings and stay home and isolate from your household if you are sick.

The Wyoming County Health Department continues to offer COVID-19 testing on Monday, Wednesday and Friday each week. Testing will be “drive through” style at the Wyoming County Highway Department located at 4328 Route 19, approximately 4 miles south of the Village of Warsaw. Results are available the same day and there is no charge. Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of Thursday, January 6, 2022, the Wyoming County Health Department reports five thousand three hundred seventy-five (5,375) lab-confirmed positive community cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. There is an increase of two hundred ninety-seven (297) cases since the last reported increase on Thursday, December 30, 2021. There are currently one hundred eighty-five (185) laboratory-confirmed active COVID-19 cases in Wyoming County.
