NEW:

When to use Covid Home Test.



If you have symptoms, test immediately

If you were exposed but don't have symptoms, test on day 4-5 (because the incubation period is 3 days)

When counting days, always count the exposure or first symptoms as day 0.

If you test negative, re-test the next day.

There is a new website, covidtests.gov where you can order 4 free at-home Covid tests per household.

- **WHEN YOU TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19:** New York State is moving toward a system of self-management when a person is positive for COVID-19 after being tested in a community setting (pharmacy, provider office, testing site etc.). According to the NYS Department of Health, residents who test positive for COVID-19 will be directed to a NYS website for isolation and quarantine

instructions. If you are COVID-19 positive, notify your close contacts that they have been exposed. NYSDOH “Frequently Asked Questions” about these changes can be found [<HERE>](#).

- **WHEN YOU TEST POSITIVE WITH COVID-19 AT-HOME TEST:** Wyoming County residents can visit www.wyomingco.net and choose “Report a Positive COVID-19 Home Test” option under the “Quick Links” to self-report a positive at home COVID-19 test. After submitting a positive result you will be able to print an “AFFIRMATION OF ISOLATION” if needed for school or work. The state is moving to self-management for anyone who tests positive or who is exposed.
- ***The Health Department does not have free at-home test kits or KN95 masks at this time; please do not call or visit the Health Department for test kits or masks.***

The Wyoming County Health Department continues to offer COVID-19 testing on Monday, Wednesday and Friday each week. Testing will be “drive through” style at the Wyoming County Highway Department located at 4328 Route 19, approximately 4 miles south of the Village of Warsaw. Results are available the same day and there is no charge. Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of Thursday, January 20, 2022, the Wyoming County Health Department reports seven thousand twenty-two (7,022) lab-confirmed positive community cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. There is an increase of four hundred forty-nine (449) total cases since the last reported increase on Thursday, January 13, 2021.
