- Wyoming County COVID-19 metrics are showing a decline in daily case reports. This is a positive sign! Please continue with protective measures that will allow these declines to continue and protect our most vulnerable residents. To keep workplaces and schools open, please do your part:
 - Wear a mask when indoors or at crowded outdoor spaces, regardless of vaccination status.
 - Remain home when you are sick and get tested if you suspect COVID.
 - Isolate if you are positive and let your close contacts know they may have been exposed.
- Wyoming County residents can visit www.wyomingco.net and choose “Report a Positive COVID-19 Home Test” option under *Quick Links* to self-report a positive at home COVID-19 test. After submitting a positive result you will be able to print an “AFFIRMATION OF ISOLATION” if needed for school or work. The state is moving to self-management for anyone who tests positive or who is exposed.
- ***The Health Department does not have free at-home test kits or KN95 masks at this time; please do not call or visit the Health Department for test kits or masks.***

The Wyoming County Health Department continues to offer COVID-19 testing on Monday, Wednesday and Friday each week. Testing will be “drive through” style at the Wyoming County Highway Department located at 4328 Route 19, approximately 4 miles south of the Village of Warsaw. Results are available the same day and there is no charge. Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of Thursday, January 27, 2022, the Wyoming County Health Department reports seven thousand three hundred forty-two (7,342) lab-confirmed positive community cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. There is an increase of three hundred twenty (320) total cases since the last reported increase on Thursday, January 20, 2022.
