- The Wyoming County Health Department will offer COVID-19 testing on Monday and Thursday each week. Testing will be at the Wyoming County Health Department located at 5362 Mungers Mill Road in Silver Springs. Results are available the same day and there is no charge. To schedule an appointment for a COVID- 19 test please visit the Wyoming County Website [HERE](#) or www.wyomingco.net and choose “COVID-19 Testing Clinic Registration” under Quick Links. Call the Wyoming County Response Line with questions or for assistance at 786-8911.
- Libraries in Wyoming County have a limited supply of COVID-19 test kits and KN95 masks to distribute to residents during normal business hours. The Health Department does not have at-home test kits or KN95 masks; please do not call or visit the Health Department for test kits or masks.
- The Wyoming County Chamber of Commerce has received a limited number of COVID-19 test kits for businesses and individuals. The kits will be distributed on a first-come/first-serve basis. Limited KN95 masks are also available. If you are interested in receiving a test kit or masks, send an email to sgardner@wyo chamber.org to make arrangements for pickup.

- Wyoming County residents can visit www.wyomingco.net and choose “Report a Positive COVID-19 Home Test” option under *Quick Links* to self-report a positive at home COVID-19 test. After submitting a positive result you will be able to print an “AFFIRMATION OF ISOLATION” if needed for school or work. The state has moved to self-management for anyone who tests positive or who is exposed to COVID-19.

Wyoming County Board of Supervisors Chairwoman, Rebecca J. Ryan announced as of Thursday, February 24, 2022, the Wyoming County Health Department reports seven thousand six hundred eighty-five (7,685) lab-confirmed positive community cases of COVID-19 among Wyoming County residents. There is an increase of thirty-two (32) total cases since the last reported increase on Thursday, February 17, 2022.
